Part 1: Silent Brainstorming

10 minutes

During this portion, you will:

- Consider the three bases of data and proposed product ideas
- Use the Jamboard to write 5 product ideas on a sticky note

Guiding prompts to help you:

- What problems need to be solved and what kind of product would solve them?
- If you could access anything, what would that look like in a product?
- What product could you envision based on the examples that were shared?
- Are there current products that could be repurposed for a different type of user?

Part 2: Group Prioritization

15 minutes

During this portion, you will:

- Discuss within your group and identify your top product ideas
- Use the Jamboard to rank them on the Importance-Urgency chart

Guiding prompts to help you:

- Which product ideas could you see immediate benefit to you?
- Which product ideas have the least barriers to implement?
- Which product ideas have the most opportunity for potential?
